

A word from our Editor-in-Chief

Inventions and inventors in Nonconventional Technologies

We are extremely pleased and grateful that the Nonconventional Technologies aside innovation at the highest peak were presented for five days, at Geneva, the capital of inventions, during 13th to 17th April 2016 at the 44th edition of the International Exhibition of Inventions.

The exhibition is under the high patronage of the Council of the Swiss Confederation, of the State Council of the Canton of Geneva, the Geneva City Council and World Intellectual Property Organization.

The Official Communiqué of the Exhibitions brings into focus one of the most prolific editions of the exhibition, edition in which were presented “only new inventions, projects and technologies that were never seen to date” in any other exhibition in the world.

This year edition, organized in the wide space of PALEXPO Geneva, it was honored by the presence of 800 exposes from more than 40 countries, and the visitors being the first witnesses of the evolution of technique brought to Geneva from five continents. There were more than 60000 visitors from the whole world who had the possibility of seeing 1000 inventions exposed at Palexpo in Hall 7.

The International Exhibition of Inventions of Geneva was structured on three sections. First, organized by the Swiss Federal Institute for the Intellectual Property, was dedicated to the National Offices for the Intellectual Property Protection and has hosted the stands of eight organisms from seven countries.

The second section, also dedicated for the visitors, was a commercial sector in which there were presented new original products that were offered directly for sale and was structured in 34 stands. The International Exhibition has brought in front of the public inventors and independent researchers, inventors from companies, research institutes and universities.

According to the official communiqué of the Exhibition, the best represented countries were: China, Thailand, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Iran, France, Poland, Romania, Korea, Germany, Switzerland, Croatia, Spain, Malaysia, Moldova and Portugal.

Hundreds of new inventions, tens of thousands of visitors, a complex cohabitation between the inventors and possible investors, between the civilizations and different cultures, the certainty that inventions are the principal element of overcoming every crisis, are just a few defining elements of the greatest International Exhibition of Inventions in the world that continues its history and contributes in an obvious way with every edition, having in consideration that each year, more than 45% of the exposed inventions were subject to licensing agreement.

The Romanian inventors were on the podium of winners, and we, those present there, we brought home the special merits that are fully entitled to our school and our people!
